School Banking. Helping kids learn the value of saving.

What pocket money can teach your child.

Pocket money can help teach kids about the value of money and how to look after it. However, there's no 'one size fits all' approach and it's important to decide what's right for your family. Research of over 1,000 parents of primary school students revealed that 55% give regular pocket money^ and here's how they manage it:



Over half give less than \$10 per week (\$5 - \$10 is the most common range). There's no right or wrong – the amount should suit your family situation.



Around 4 in 5 parents link pocket money to the completion of a chore or task. This can help children understand that money needs to be earned.



On average, kids save about half of their pocket money each week. Learning to put money aside for a bigger goal is a valuable life skill.

Holy Trinity Primary School Individual Music Tuition Opportunities

If your son or daughter would like to learn an instrument, Holy Trinity Primary School has a number of specialist private teachers available to provide instrument tuition during school hours.

Our instrumental teachers are happy to provide progress feedback to parents and are able to prepare students for exams. Lessons take place during school hours. In order to minimise disruption to your child's classroom program the instrumental teachers try to vary lesson times each week.

We currently offer tuition in piano, guitar and violin. Other instruments may be offered if there is sufficient interest so please ask!

There are currently vacancies for piano and violin. Expressions of interest for new guitar students are also welcome.

Fees and payments are negotiated directly between parents and music teachers, but generally range between \$35-45 per lesson. If your child is unable to attend their lesson, it is the responsibility of the parent to notify their music teacher directly.

Parents of young students or those commencing an instrument for the first time are welcome to attend initial lessons to assist in settling their child and establishing shared expectations with the teacher.

Information about our current music teachers is available from the private music tuition coordinator. You will need to make direct contact with your preferred teacher to arrange lessons.

NetSetGo: Ages 7-9 - Year 2 and 3. Modified netball rules, no finals. Played at 9am Juniors: Ages 10-12.


NetSetGo SET: Divisions 1 (Yr 3) & Division 2 (Yr 2) Modified rules, no finals, playing at 9am until 10am.


